The Emergency Preparedness Plan (EPP)



Illinois School Safety Drill Act

<u>Purpose</u>: to establish minimum requirements and standards for schools to follow when conducting school safety drills and reviewing school emergency and crisis response plans and to encourage schools and first responders to work together for the safety of children (Public Act 94-600;105 ILCS 128/10)

Required Drills: during each academic year, each school is required to conduct the following drills:

- ☐ Three (3) fire evacuation drills, one of which much include participation by local fire department
- ☐ One (1) bus evacuation drill
- ☐ One (1) law enforcement drill to address a shooting incident which much include participation by local law enforcement
- ☐ One (1) severe weather and shelter-in-place drill to address tornado incidents

<u>Annual Review</u>: each school district is required to conduct an annual review of each of its schools' emergency response plans, procedures and protocols. The school district shall invite representatives from local first responders.



School Security & Standards Task Force



Report to the Illinois Governor and the General Assembly - January 1, 2016 Active Intruder Training:

- In consultation with local law enforcement, schools and school districts may consider adopting procedures for students and staff to follow in the event of an intruder or breach of facility security. Such procedures may include "Run, Hide, Fight"; Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate (ALICE); or any.other.procedures/program deemed appropriate for the needs of students and staff as determined by the school or school district in consultation with local law enforcement. It is recommended that any such procedure/program:
 - ☐ Be easily understood and applicable to both faculty and students;
 - ☐ Help empower faculty and students to make life-saving choices and to take control of a situation until local law enforcement arrives; and
 - ☐ Builds a "delay" mechanism that provides local law enforcement additional time to respond and react (pg. 8).

Key Features

- ☐ All Hazards Response the EPP includes multiple response protocols
- ☐ Incident Command Teams the EPP incorporates the Incident Command System whereby staff have defined roles and responsibilities
- □ Student & Staff Accountability the EPP includes procedures to account for everyone
- ☐ Off-Site Evacuation/Reunification the EPP has identified off-site locations and a documented procedure for reunification of parent to child
- ☐ Communication the EPP includes communication procedures
- ☐ Aftermath the EPP includes processes to help identify and align resources to help support students, their families and staff

Other important items:

- ☐ Partnership with Police & Fire
- ☐ Knowledge of community resources
- ☐ Use of Mobile technology

History of the 4E program

In 2010, 2 local officers brought MACTAC to St. Louis region

Since then, 60 Police Departments and 40 Fire Departments participated in joint training

EDUCATE



Educate

- Train ahead of time to know your options (revert back to training)
- Knowledge = Power
- Communication is the key to survival!







EVADE



Evade

- Lockdown
 - Students Grades K-8 are currently trained on this option
 - Still a <u>safe</u> option



ESCAPE



Escape...where to go?

Rally Points (RP):

- meeting area for students, staff and visitors

Reunification Point (RUP):

- -Staging area for parents, students, etc.
- -This is far away from the attack location

Teachers will be sharing the identified Rally Points with students - Grades K-8



ENGAGE



Engage

You <u>can</u> survive contact with an armed intruder!

- Disrupt and/or distract him
 - Noise
 - Movement
 - Distance
 - Distractions/improvised weapons

Conversation with students will be based on age and maturity level at each grade

Student Behavior Management



Philosophies

District 27 encourages student voice, connection with staff, and empowers students so every student has at least one staff member with whom they feel comfortable sharing safety concerns.

Hickory Point - Concept of safety and reporting (tattling vs. telling)

Shabonee - Bystander power, Reporting (tattling vs. telling), personal safety, recognizing unsafe behaviors/situations

Wood Oaks - Importance of reporting, being an upstander, awareness of signs of unsafe behaviors


